LOCATION	AGREED ACTIONS	IMPLEMENTATION
Chapel Common	Playground facilities to be retained. Area in eastern half of Common adjacent to playground to be mowed to allow for its use as a play / games area. Western half of Common and roadside verges to be retained as wild flower area. – and not to be cut until after seeding. All grass and wildflower cuttings to be collected and deposited along southern edge of Common.	To be undertaken by local residents on a roster basis managed by Jess Shaw. Richard Mighall will mow public footpath CL 6 where it crosses the Common.
Orchard Common	Strips immediately adjacent to fruit trees to be kept short whilst consideration to be given for development of rest of Common as a wild flower area.	Development and funding of wild flower area to be researched by Ian Ruse. Mowing to be investigated
Meadow Common	Grass to be allowed to grow and harvested for hay.	To be offered to Gillian Lloyd and family.
Bake Lane Commons	All 6 Commons to be allowed to remain in a wild state to encourage flora and fauna. Path to be kept open for walkers and cleared as required.	Path access to be managed by John Neville and Richard Mighall.
Church Lanes Common (Upper)	Currently overgrown; a narrow through track to be created with the sides allowed to thicken to encourage flora and fauna..	To be managed by Jess Shaw with support of Anne Meres and Candia Compton.
Church Lanes Common (Lower)	Path to be maintained throughout its length up to point where it meets with unclassified footpath leading to Church Road.	To be managed by Mervyn Powell and Will Bullough.
Roadside Verge Commons (including Wall Covert)	Management to be left to the discretion of adjacent home owners subject to complying with the Scheme of Regulations for the Common.	As per proposal.
